ICS-200: ICS for Single Resources and Initial Actions

Dates: September 27 & 29, October 1 - 6:30pm to 10:30pm

Course Overview: ICS 200 is designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the Incident Command System (ICS). ICS-200 provides training on and resources for personnel who are likely to assume a supervisory position within the ICS. This is the second in a series of ICS courses designed to meet the all-hazard, all-agency NIMS ICS requirement for operational personnel

Pre-requisites: ICS-100 and NIMS-700, must be presented before class

NJ EMT CEUs: 12 Elective CEUs

ICS-300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents

Dates: October 8 & 11 6:30pm – 10:30pm, October 9 & 10 9:00am -5:00pm

Course Overview: This course covers organization and staffing, organizing for incidents and events, resource management, and air operation. ICS-100 and ICS-200 are both prerequisites to the ICS-300 course. Objectives include how the NIMS Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents. Describe the incident/event management process for expanding incidents and supervisors as prescribed by the Incident Command System. Implement the incident management process on a simulated Type 3 incident. Develop an Incident Action Plan for a simulated incident

Pre-requisites: ICS100, ICS200 & NIMS700, must be presented before class

ICS-400: Advanced ICS

Dates: October 16 & 17 9:00am – 5:00pm

Course Overview: This course expands upon the material covered in ICS 100 through ICS 300. ICS 400 focuses on large single-agency and complex multi-agency/multi-jurisdictional incident response. The course addresses area command and staff issues, as well as the planning, logistical and fiscal considerations associated with complex incident management and interagency coordination. Objectives include how the NIMS Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents.

Pre-requisites: ICS100, ICS200, ICS300 and NIMS 700, must be presented before class
